


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


## **MISSION STATEMENT**


- Over the past couple of years, wehavehad aslightdecrease in student numbers.

### 01

#### Professional Learning

The last three years our teachers have been learning about reading. This year the focus is going to switch to writing which is a natural step to further develop our students literacy skills.



New ELA Curriculum K-6, and piloting new curriculum jr high curriculum.





Teachers will implement the instructional strategies that they have learned into the classes, focusing on reading and writing.



- 3Ts provide a snapshot three times a year, which guides reading instruction.
- Biweekly curriculum based measures monitor the progress of specific students' growth.

#### **Professional Learning**

During the 2024-25 school year, our teachers participated in UDL professional learning. WE are going to continue to learn about UDL priniples through the lens of neuroscience and discuss how the human brain learns.

Teachers are required to utilize UDL principles in all their numeracy and literacy classes, this learning will provide answer to the "why" we do what we do, which is motivating for teachers.




